Border Security Force (BSF) and other border protection agencies in last three years and what is the religious distribution of these illegal infiltrators; and

(b) whether Government recognizes the right of these refugees belonging to different religions to stay in India and obtain Indian citizenship subsequently?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI MULLAPPALLY RAMACHANDRAN): (a) Information as per reports available is given below:—

Data pertaining to religious distribution of the illegal infiltrators is not centrally maintained.

(b) As per Section 5(1) of the Citizenship Act, 1955, an illegal migrant is not eligible to become a citizen of India. Therefore, there is no question of any right of such people to become citizens of India.

People killed in Kashmir insurgency

1156. SHRI Y.S. CHOWDARY: Will the Minister of HOME AFFAIRS be pleased to state:

- (a) the details of people killed in Kashmir insurgency civilian and policemen between January, 1990 to April, 2011;
 - (b) the details of militants killed during the above period; and
 - (c) the details of compensation paid during the above period?

THE MINISTER OF STATE IN THE MINISTRY OF HOME AFFAIRS (SHRI JITENDRA SINGH): (a) and (b) As per reports of Jammu and Kashmir Government, 13226 civilians and 5369 Security Force personnel have been killed in terrorist violence in Jammu and Kashmir during the period from year 1990 to April, 2011. Similarly, 21323 terrorists have been killed during the same period.

(c) Relief is a State subject. As per the Jammu and Kashmir Government's Relief policy, the Next of Kins (NoKs) of civilian victims of terrorist violence as well as Security Force personnel are sanctioned ex-gratia amounts based on extent orders in this regard.
